



The Cold War History Research Center is now accepting applications for Summer Interns! (Deadline 30 of April, 2018).

At the Research Center, Interns will have the opportunity to learn about and contribute to the expanding knowledge of the history of the Cold War. Through the internship, students will be given assignments to further explore scholarly research on the Cold War. The Internship will be done in English, but additional language skills, especially in central and eastern European languages, are an asset. Interns will gain a deeper understanding of the Cold War through work with the chronology, bibliography, and translation projects, while also contributing to the collective understanding of the history of the Cold War.

DURATION

✓ 9 weeks + flexible duration (July 23, 2018 – September 24, 2018).

REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ English level B2 and (additional language skills are an asset.)
- ✓ Applicants should be in their final years of their B.A. or M.A. in History, International Relations, or a related field.
- ✓ Background in archival research, translating, and proof reading is an asset.

PROJECTS AND POSSIBLE TASKS

- ✓ Collecting archival information from the Open Society Archive (OSA) to contribute to the ongoing English language chronology of the Cold War.
- ✓ Interns will be assigned a country or countries to look into and collect the documentation showing events happening within the country pertaining to the history of the Cold War.
- ✓ Participating in the collection of books and articles on the Cold War to help form a multilingual bibliography of scholarly works about the Cold War.
- ✓ Translating diplomatic documents into English so that they can be used by a broader audience.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ✓ For most of the projects, interns will have a flexible working schedule that may allow for remote work to be done.
- ✓ Assignments will be supervised by the Center's Research Coordinator, with additional instruction by the Center's Director.
